<p>Math</p>	<p><b>Learning Targets:</b></p> <p>I can measure time intervals. <p>Science</p>	<p><b>Learning Targets:</b> We have Science Fridays! Last week we did an investigation testing what is attracted by magnets and what isn't.</p>
